ROCHESTOWN PARK HOTEL

20K ROUTE



The hotel is centred around the historical house of Sir Abraham Sutton, former Lord Mayor of Cork. Constructed in the early 1900's, it served as a family home until 1947 when it began use as a seminary. It has been restored and expanded over the past 20 years into current hotel.



CENTRAL STATISTICS OFFICE

The headquarters of the Central Statist<mark>ics Office on Skehar</mark>d Road.



CIT BLACKROCK CASTLE OBSERVATORY

20K ROUTE




A defensive structure was first constructed here in the late 16th Century though the current Blackrock Castle was rebuilt in 1829 following a fire. It fell into disrepair in the 20th Century and has now been converted into an observatory and exhibition centre.

LACKROCK VILLAGE

20K ROUTE




Originally a fishing village on the outskirts of Cork City but is now subsumed by it.



ELYSIAN TOWER

From Kennedy Park you can see the Elysian Tower, at 71m tall and with 17 floors, it is the tallest storied building in Ireland. It was completed in late 2008.



From Eamonn DeValera bridge you c<mark>an see Cork Cit</mark>y Hall Designed by architects Jones & Kelly and opened in 1936 it is the headquarters of Cork City Council and is also home to a concert hall

CUSTOMS HOUSE

20K ROUTE



Designed by Abraham Hargrave and opened in 1818. Since 1882 it has been the headquarters of the Cork Harbour Commission.

20K ROUTE



Cork (a name that means Marsh) first became an important sea port when the Vikings settled on the banks of the River Lee in the 10th Century. Ocean-going vessels, right up to the 18th Century, docked in the deep waters that once lay under today's Patrick Street and the Grand Parade.

CORK OPERA HOUSE

20K ROUTE



Originally built in 1855 to a design by John Benson, it burned down in 1955. It finally reopened in 1963 and was renovated in 2003.

ST. MARY'S CATHOLIC CHURCH



Opened in 1839 after 7 years of construction, the portico is a more recent addition from 1861. A 14th Century statue of Our Lady of the Graces is contained inside.

SHANDON

20K ROUTE



Though a church first existed on this site since 1199, the present building dates from 1722. The red sandstone and white limestone <mark>used t</mark>o bui<mark>ld the</mark> church would go on to provide Cork with its official colours. Its first rector was Rev. Arthur Hyde, the great-great-grandfather of Douglas Hyde.

ST. VINCENT'S BRIDGE

20K ROUTE



Opened in 1878 it is named after the nearby St. Vincent's Church. It was built with funds from the Cork Improvement Act of 1875.



The first Mercy University Hospital was opened in 1857 as a small 40-bed hospital staffed by just f<mark>our sist</mark>ers. It has since grown to the current 350-bed hospital employing over 1,000 people.

UNIVERSITY COLLEGE COR


20K ROUTE



UCC was established in 1845 as one of three Queen's Colleges on the island. It became University College Cork back in 1908. The famou<mark>s fron</mark>t qu<mark>adrang</mark>le was designed by Deane & Woodward. From an initial enrolment of just 115, the college now has over 18,000 students.

THE LOUGH

10K LOOP ROUTE



The 4 hectare lough is a shallow limestone lake. It was designated a Public Wildlife Refuge in 1881 and is home to a large number of wildlife, including a large population of swans. The lough itself is dominated by carp.



The Cork home of Munster rugby, the grounds came into their possession in 1938, though the war de<mark>layed t</mark>he development of the ground. Due for a major redevelopment recently, plans were scaled back due to financial constraints.

CORK CITY FOOTBALL CLUI



Turner's Cross Stadium is home to Cork City Football Club. Along with the Aviva Stadium it is one of only two fully covered allseater <mark>stadia</mark> in Ireland.

ST. FINBARR'S CEMETERY



First opened in the mid-19th Century, St. Finbarr's is the city's largest cemetery. Its most famous denizen is former Taoiseach Jack Lynch

CORK UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL



Founded in 1978, CUH is the largest teaching hospital in Ireland with 1,000 beds and over 3,000 staff.

CORK INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY



Founded in 1974 as a successor to the Cork Regional Technical Colleg<mark>e, CIT now ha</mark>s over 12,00<mark>0 studen</mark>ts <mark>and its c</mark>ampus has won many awards for architectural design. Recognised by The Sunday Times as IT of the Year in Ireland.

CITY GAOL



Designed in 1818 by James and Georg<mark>e Pain, this imp</mark>ressive lookin<mark>g House of Correct</mark>ion has been acquired by UCC and incorporated into its campus.
